- Scroll down to Footer.
- For all the social media icons, Using **findElements**, find the respective URLs of all the social media icons and print them on system console (Image 1.1) (2 marks)
- Right click on all the social media icon one by one and open them in a new window. Get the title of the new window and print the same on the system console (figure above) (3 marks)
- Scroll up where the number of days etc. are shown (see image 1.2 below), Extract the number of days, hours, minutes, and seconds, convert to integer, and print on console. (3 marks)
- Assert that the seconds and minutes are less than 60, and hours are less than 24 (2 mark)

Do the following steps in a data driven test format. Execute the following steps for the given excel sheet below.

- Visit https://mockexam2cpsat.agiletestingalliance.org/
- Click on the "ABOUT" Menu
- Scroll down to List of Candidates Table
- Create a data driven test, such that for every row in the figure above, it is able to confirm if the details are true and match one of the rows for participant table or not. (10 marks)
- If the details are matching, it should write to a separate file. e.g for Test 1, it should write Test 1
 <details> Passed otherwise failed. (5 marks applicable only if the previous step is done properly)

Please note that every row must be run as a separate test. In other words, you should not validate all the rows of the excel sheet in one test.

No marks will be given if the test is not data driven.

So if the year parameter is sent as 199, it should return a list with two rows having the number of participants as per the figure below. (City 3 and City 4 -> number of candidates 6000+ and 8000+)

- a) Visit https://mockexam2cpsat.agiletestingalliance.org/
- b) Click on the "ABOUT" Menu
- c) Scroll down to Accordian (Image 4.1) 1 mark
- d) In a while loop (Using FindElements) 5 marks
 - Click on + signs for all the sections
 - Extract the content of the sections and print it on the system console
 - Take screenshot of expanded section
 - Note the background color of the section bar before clicking the + sign and after clicking the sign. Print the color on system console.
- e) Scroll down to CP-SAT Advisory Board (Image 4.2) 3 mark
 - Using findElements find the names of all the speakers and print the same on system console
 - In a loop open the hrefs and assert if the linkedin page opened is of correct speaker or not. (do not assert the hreft, you have to open the href and then check if the speaker name is present or not)
- f) Scroll down to #ATAGTR2021 Twitter Feed (Image 4.3) 3 marks
 - For all the carousel tweets, read the message and print it on the system console
- g) Go to the section where the logos of CPSAT are shown (image 4.4) 3 marks
 - Take the mouse over the respective logos
 - Tool tips are shown take a screen shot showing the tooltips for each logo
 - Extract the tool tip and print on the console for each of the logo
